Word Definitions

- 1. **Anger:** a feeling (emotion) of great displeasure; exasperation; affliction; to strangle; a feeling which strangles or chokes;
- 2. **Wrath:** resentful anger; rage; revengeful; seeking ways to get even; an overflow of anger;
- 3. Cause: a reason;
- 4. **Reason:** the basis or motive for an action; a decision or a belief; justification for doing something;

5. **Excuse:** (ex= away; cause= accusation): to seek to remove blame from self:

6. **Response:** answer to a situation based on the Word of God;

7. **Reaction:** answer to a situation based on emotions (react to another's actions)

Some Results of Unresolved Anger

- 1. Anger causes you to seethe (boil) inside.
- 2. Anger causes violent reactions.
- 3. Anger causes emotional hurt to you and others.
- 4. Anger causes mental anxiety.
- 5. Anger can increase the risk for heart disease, high blood pressure, ulcers, and other illnesses.
- 6. Anger directly relates to unforgiveness.
- 7. Unresolved anger will cause you to lose your soul.
- 8. Anger will cause others around you to be defiled.
- 9. Unresolved anger will cause a root of bitterness to spring up in your heart.
