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### **Discussion Points/Questions:**

Using Jonah 1:8-9 and St. Matthew 26:69-75, talk about the differences between Jonah and Peter. Both were faced with sharing Truth, but each one took a different path. One was faithful - even in disobedience, and one was fearful.

1. What are some differences in how Jonah responded and how Peter reacted. What similarities do you see?
2. How is it possible for you to deny Christ, yet be a witness for Him?
3. Why do you think that Jonah was so comfortable in the midst of his disobedience?
4. Talk about things that you need to throw overboard as you awaken from your spiritual sleep.
5. Discuss how you can be spiritually asleep and not realize it.

### **SisStar Reflections**

1. When you are disobedient to the Word of God, that is the same as running from God - and the result will be the PIT.
2. Just as God sent Jonah on an errand of Mercy, so does He send you to others (your enemy, for example) to extend Mercy - and not to get revenge.
3. As you let your light shine in the midst of your enemies, God will be glorified by your obedience.
4. If you expect to continue to receive God's Grace and Mercy, you must give as He has given to you.

5. Just as God is in control of the elements, He is in control of your life. Trust Him and follow where He leads.
6. God is Omnipresent - which means He is everywhere at the same time. You can't run from the presence of God.
