**(The Line of Christ can be traced through the Southern Kingdom)**

**(Note St. Matthew 1 and St. Luke 3)**

Matthew starts with Abraham and traces the line up through Joseph, the husband of Mary. Luke traces the line from Joseph (Mary) and goes back to Adam. The genealogies show that both were from the line of David. The Lord promised that the King of kings would come through the line of David.

The term “BC” means “Before Christ” or “this many years” before Christ was born as a human. So the number 586 BC, for example, means “586 years before Christ was born.” So counting of time moved backwards prior to the birth of Christ, showing the number of years before He was born.

The term “AD” means “Anno Domini” which means “In the Year of our Lord.” So 2026 is 2026 years after the birth of Christ. So after the birth of Christ, time began to be counted forward. The Julian and the Gregorian calendar systems divide time as BC and AD, coinciding with Biblical times.

The last book in the Old Testament is Malachi, and was written approximately 400 years prior to the birth of our Lord. From Malachi until the first Century AD, there was 400 years of silence. This means that there was no Word from God, and no prophet was on the scene for 400 years. The first prophet after Malachi is John, the Baptist.
