

Summary Paragraph

We are often so focused on what's next—our next job, next blessing, next breakthrough—that we overlook what God is doing *right now*.

This lesson reminded us that **our "now" is not a waiting room—it's a divine assignment.**Where you are right now is not random; it's **strategic positioning** by God.

Key Scripture: Esther 4:14 (NLT) —

"If you keep quiet at a time like this, deliverance and relief for the Jews will arise from some other place... Who knows if perhaps you were made queen for just such a time as this?"

Lesson Breakdown

- 1 Living in the Present: "Your Now Has Purpose"
 - We can become so future-focused that we forget the value of today.
 - The *present* is where God shapes, tests, and prepares us.
 - David's "sheep season" (tending sheep before becoming king) looked small, but it prepared him for greatness.
 - o He didn't despise the sheep; he learned leadership through them.
 - o Likewise, our humble or hidden seasons have divine purpose.
 - **Takeaway:** Don't rush your now—grow through it.



2 Example: The Story of Bernard

- Katrina shared a personal story about "Bernard," a man with disabilities from her childhood neighborhood.
- Her sister worked in a job she disliked for years—but that position allowed her to help Bernard later in life and place him in a good home.
- That same job later equipped her to navigate life when her own daughter was diagnosed with autism.

Lesson:

- o God may keep you in a place you don't enjoy because He's using you to bless someone else.
- The struggles you face now may be the training you need for your next assignment.

Takeaway: Sometimes your "now" isn't about you—it's about who God wants to reach through you.

3 Esther's Example: Positioned for Purpose

- Esther didn't rise to royalty for comfort; she rose for *calling*.
- Mordecai reminded her that she had been elevated for a divine reason—to deliver her people.
- If she stayed silent, God would still move—but she'd miss her moment.

Key Point:

- o God's plan will always move forward—but when you walk in obedience, you get to be part of it.
- Your placement is not random; your influence, job, or role is an assignment.

Ouote from the lesson:

"Your crown isn't for comfort—it's for calling."



Modern Application: Living Out Your Faith in Every Space

- Wherever you are—your workplace, home, or community—you are called to represent the goodness of God.
- We don't change who we are based on where we are.
- Your consistency in faith can reveal God's love to people who've never experienced it.

Takeaway:

- o Be the "goodness of the Lord" others need to see in the land of the living (Psalm 27:13).
- o Let your life reflect His light in every environment.

5 Living with Eternal Urgency

- We were reminded that life is temporary and precious.
- If we truly believed our time was limited, we'd forgive quicker, love deeper, and repent faster.

Reflection Questions:

- o Who do I need to forgive today?
- o What grudges or disappointments am I still carrying?
- o Am I living like I'll be here forever—or like I'm preparing to meet God?

Analogy: Katrina compared life choices to making a reservation—"smoking or non-smoking." Every action, attitude, and decision we make today determines where our eternal reservation will be.

Key Truth: Live every day like it's your last opportunity to honor God.



6 Purpose in Pain: Finding God in Every Season

- Life will bring loss, grief, and disappointment—but even those seasons are purposeful.
- The teacher shared her husband's grief after losing loved ones, reminding us that God can use even pain as a place of growth.

Takeaway:

- o Don't rush through grief, waiting for it to pass.
- o God is *in* your grief—teaching, strengthening, and refining you.
- o Every season (even the hard ones) has divine significance.

7 Final Encouragement

- You may not like where you are right now, but heaven has you right where you need to be.
- Whether your current "now" is full of joy or pain, it's part of God's plan.
- Your job is to stay faithful, obedient, and sensitive to what God is doing in the moment.

Quote to Remember:

"You may not like where you are, but you are exactly where heaven needs you to be."



Reflection & Application

- 1. What area of your life feels uncomfortable right now—and what might God be teaching you there?
- 2. Who might God be calling you to serve, comfort, or deliver in this season?
- 3. Are you living with spiritual urgency or earthly distraction?
- 4. How can you glorify God right where you are?

Katrina's Final encouragement

God isn't waiting for your "next." He's working *in your now*.

Your "now" is your **training ground, testimony, and territory.**So instead of rushing to the future, ask:

"Lord, what are You teaching me in this moment?"
